#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

#### Parent /Teacher Information Nights

It has been lovely to meet a number of parents from Kindy, Year 1 & 2 thus far. There are two parts to the Information Nights. The Stage Presentation made by each stage gives you an idea of the expectations, protocols and practices/programs that have been collaboratively developed by the stage teachers and are used across the Stage. This is followed by a Class Presentation presented by the teacher specifically for that particular class. After the presentations, parents can negotiate with the teachers if need be a time to meet further to discuss student's needs that have not been addressed.

Please keep in mind that the current set up is a response to Covid measures from the DoE and that this early in the year Staff are assessing student performance in various subjects. In previous years, initial meetings have been for 10 minutes only and having twenty or more students in a class makes meetings difficult for staff to administer. In this way, we hope the same messages for all stages and classes can be conveyed, with an option for further meetings if needed. There will be another session in second semester where the format will be different and more geared towards student progress.



## Compost - Bins are located next to the top gates on Bridge street.

All parents are welcome to bring their food scraps to the school compost bins - please bring along some shredded paper or egg cartons to add with other scraps as this keeps our composts healthy. If you have time, turn the compost with the turner (skewer action). Cockroaches, slaters and fly larvae are all part of composting (along with worms) system so don't be surprised to see them!

## Coffee Grounds Initiative (Cafe Sophia)

Anyone able to spare 5 minutes a week to pick up coffee grounds at about 2.55 pm ? We need daily volunteers to pick up the caddy, empty into the compost and to drop it back to Cafe Sophia on MON, TUES, THURS and FRI.
