Principal Reporting

SRC – I just wanted to acknowledge the work that many of our students are completing in relation to student identified and led projects targeting many aspects of our school operations. These include sustainability, lost property and curriculum. Thank you to Ms. Ahearn who is guiding and supporting students in identifying, planning and implementing the changes that students want to see across our school.

Leaving school grounds - a reminder that students who are on site from 8:30 a.m. when staff supervision begins are not permitted to leave school grounds. This is part of our duty of care and a legal obligation of the school. Students who leave grounds will be placed on level 3 of our school discipline system which incurs two days of reflection.

Crunch and sip – Just to reiterate that 'Crunch and Sip' is not an official break from work but an opportunity for students to have a healthy snack that gives an energy boost to get to lunch. With this in mind, snacks should be healthy and easy to access so they can be consumed whilst class work continues.

Uniforms – we have a number of clothing items in our lost property at the moment, please feel free to claim what is yours. On uniform related matters, our uniform is a green jumper, not a colour of your choice. Students who have made representative teams or carnivals and have the apparel to proclaim it - well done but I'd like to see these jumpers, hoodies etc. only worn on Fridays – our sports day.

TTFM – As mentioned elsewhere in this newsletter Tell Them From Me of occurring again this year. This is a mandatory requirement from the department to all schools. The data we collect informs our practices and programs that are listed in our School Improvement Plan (SIP). The more data we collect the more explicit our support can be for students.

Lock down drill - this week we had a lockdown drill to practice our response to trespass. It is mandatory for schools to complete drills relating to lock outs, lock downs and evacuation. These are completed yearly. These mandatory reviews and drills help us to best plan for multiple contingencies.

Check in assessment – this week stages 2 and 3 have had students complete check in assessments. These assessments supplement naplan and allow us to track student progress against curriculum proficiency standards. It also allows us as a staff the opportunity to 'tweak' our practice or adjust / reassess programs and pedagogy.

Reconciliation week - This week has been reconciliation week. On Friday afternoon our week will culminate with an assembly to commemorate this. All are invited to see our talented students from stage 3 perform as well as the musicianship of the stage 3 teachers supporting!



WELLBEING AT ERKO

This week children in Years 4-6 have completed the Tell Them From Me survey. These surveys help us to measure student engagement and wellbeing. We appreciate all the children who participated and Ruby Logan who helped organise and run the surveys for all classes. The results will be in soon and the Wellbeing Team will be analysing the results and using them to support our teaching, learning and future wellbeing directions. Parents and teachers will also be given the opportunity to complete the survey later in the year so we can hear the voices from everyone in the community.

Buddy classes will be continuing to focus on our value of respect this week. Children will be learning about how they can be respectful towards themselves. Having self-respect helps to create a strong sense of wellbeing and build self-esteem. We will be discussing strategies to help children develop self-respect, such as having a growth mindset, using positive self-talk and creating healthy habits. It would be great if families continued these conversations in the home environment as well. Playground Safety correct use of Equipment



Dear Parents and Families,

Students continue to have fun on the climbing equipment that has been provided by the P&C. At the beginning of each year, and throughout the year, students are shown a slide presentation of the rules of the climbing equipment. Images, along with the 'Dos and Don'ts' of the climbing frame provide clear instructions for students to help them remain safe. When these are not adhered to, students may be requested to leave the climbing equipment and sit out of play for their own, and others', safety. The rules for the use of the equipment are summarised here:

- We need to remember to walk around the dome so that we don't trip over the wooden frame.
- We need to climb sensibly. This means we always have at least one foot and one hand on the climbing frame at all times.
- We must stay inside the silver metal frame. It is **very unsafe** to climb over the outside or top of the silver frame.
- We need to use the blue slide safely.
 - This means:
 - -One person at a time.
 - -Sit on your bottom and go feet first.
- We need to use the swinging chair safely. This means:
 - -One person goes on the chair at a time
 - -We take turns so nobody misses out
- We must keep our hands, feet, and objects to ourselves.
- Games involving tips or pushing are not safe games to play on the dome. You can play tips in the rest of the playground spaces.
- When we want to get down, we climb.
- We do not jump from the dome.

If everyone follows these rules, everyone will be safer.


