Principal's Message

Carpark gate - ramp – As our new access point to the school is fully functional, can people please use the pedestrian gate. It will be unlocked even if it appears shut. Staff, external agencies and contractor's use this entrance from early morning to the evening.

Naplan – We are awaiting the finalised reports from DoE for Naplan. When this is received our results and insights will be shared at P & C.

Lost property - Earlier this week you would have received a message regarding the lost property in Brown Hall. We have tried any number of initiatives to improve this space to no avail. Last year the school spent over a \$1000 with storage and tubs. This is impacting on our learning spaces and Gowrie's space when they are running programs. From next term collections for good will, the second-hand store and waste will occur three times a term.

School bytes - Notifications - Just a reminder that to ensure all communications are received that you turn on notifications for school bytes.

Reports – We are aiming to send home reports from Wednesday in week 10. Currently Assistant Principal's and I are looking at reports for final edits if needed. Our reports will look very similar from last years, the only changes being point form in the comments section will make feedback succinct and to the point and the 'sound' grading has become 'expected'.

Parent communicating with School – We have finalised communication guidelines for parents when staff and parents need to meet to discuss concerns and the way these processes are to occur. This has been endorsed by the P & C executive. If you are interested in looking at this document, it will be found on the school website under policies.

Process for dealing with issues - Our process for the dealing with issues, behaviour or incidents is as follows. Generally, staff on class or teachers on duty will investigate issues and manage the outcomes arising. If issues persist or are part of a larger issue, Assistant Principals will deal with this situation and help to resolve it. It is only after this point that I will become involved. This may mean that going through this process, issues of concern get to me after these first stages have been working through. I am always happy to discuss with any concerned individual - via email, phone or in person what their concerns are at this stage.


New Maths Resources Funded by Our P&C!

Stage 3 Chau Chak Wing Museum

On Friday, Stage 3 had an excursion to Chau Chak Wing Museum in the University of Sydney. There were 4 groups. One with Ms. Newnham, one with Ms. Cooper, one with Ms. Cecire, and one with Ms. Pak. Some went to see the 12 labours of Heracles (Hercules), while some went to identify ancient artifacts. We also saw a Lego version of Pompeii and saw some ancient Egyptian stuff. Then, stage 3 saw a statue of a naked Hermes. We also saw a goat's skull that was like Janus and a horse's skull that was like a cyclops.



We then saw animals and went to see the China room. There was a video playing there and it looked a lot like fungus. We then went back to school with lunch and recess merged.






